Turn to the back of this packet to find the activities you need to complete. Select **two options** from the list below to complete, using the book you read for your **Summer Reading** assignment. Your project must include the following: The **title** of the book, the **author's** name and your full name. To demonstrate excellence, your project should meet all requirements, be **bold, colorful, neat**, and **thorough** in presentation. A **typed copy** of your project is **due to your Language Arts teacher during the second week of school.**

- 1- <u>Book-Inspired Poem and Illustration-</u>Write an original poem that connects to the book you have read. Your poem should focus on key elements such as the **plot**, the **main character's emotions**, or your **personal connection** to the story. Your poem must be **at least thirty lines long**, use vivid language, imagery, and emotion to reflect the themes and experiences in the book, and **include an illustration** that visually connects your poem to the story. This can be hand-drawn or digitally created. Be creative, thoughtful, and make sure your poem and illustration clearly relate to the book's content and message.
- 2- Movie Poster Design Book Advertisement-Create a movie-style poster to advertise your book as if it were being released as a major film. Your poster should include: A creative title and slogan that captures the heart of the story. Images of real actors you would cast as the main characters. Artwork, symbols, and colors reflect the story's plot, themes, and mood, and a design that gives viewers a clear idea of what the book is about.

Be **creative and detailed**, this is your chance to visually sell the story as a professional movie promotion. Use color, bold visuals, and thoughtful symbolism to make your poster stand out.

- 3- Story Timeline Visual Project-Create a timeline featuring at least 8 major events from your book. Your timeline should be both visually engaging and informative. Be sure to include the following: **Drawings or magazine cutouts** to represent each key event. **Captions** that clearly describe what happens in each event and why it is important. **Color and creativity** to make your timeline visually appealing and easy to follow. Make sure the events are in **chronological order** and reflect the most important moments in the story.
- 4- Movie Pitch Two Page- Write a two-page pitch to a movie producer explaining why this story would make a great film. Your pitch should include a summary of the story's most compelling elements—such as its plot, characters, themes, and setting—and explain why these aspects would appeal to audiences on the big screen. In addition, include one paragraph about the author, highlighting their background, writing style, and achievements. Explain why the author would be an excellent choice to help produce or consult on film adaptation. You should visit the author's official website to conduct research and gather accurate information for this part of the assignment. Be sure your writing is clear, persuasive, and free of spelling and grammar errors.
- 5- <u>Character Diary Minimum of 3 Journal Entries</u>-Write a character diary from the perspective of the main character in the story. Create at least **three journal entries**. Each entry should describe key events that happened during the story and include reflections on how those events affected the character and why. Each entry must be **at least half a page long** and should demonstrate your best spelling, grammar, and writing skills.
